

## Advanced Nurse Practitioner (ANP)

### Job Description and Responsibilities:

- Manage a clinical caseload
- Diagnosing and treating patients with minor illnesses, ailments and injuries – history taking, physical examination, problem-solving and clinical decision-making, to establish a diagnosis and management plan
- Prioritise and triage the needs of patients accordingly, making any necessary referrals for investigations
- Clinical care – interventions, medications, assessment, wound care and management, cervical screening, ear care, vaccines, pre-travel health, prescribed therapies
- Health promotion – alcohol screening, smoking cessation, healthy diet, physical activity, weight management, sexual health and family planning
- Long term conditions – screening, diagnosis, ongoing management, and referral to other agencies in line with NICE guidance and Quality and Outcome Framework indicators
- Write and review prescriptions
- Distribute and administer medication and controlled drugs
- Quality assurance and service support
- Promote evidence-based practice through the use of the latest research-based guidelines and the development of practice-based research
- Recognise opportunities to reduce inequalities and unwarranted variation
- Handle sensitive and confidential information
- Ensuring the privacy, dignity and safety of individuals is maintained at all times
- Use of clinical IT systems, and maintaining accurate patient records
- Recognise and report issues relating to safeguarding vulnerable children and adults

- Postgraduate Diploma/Degree in Advanced Practice
- Evidence of continuous professional development
- Non-Medical Prescriber qualification
